

## Reading books

Reading books are to go home every night. Listening to your child read regularly really enables them to progress, not only in reading but also other areas of Literacy. Please use www.bugclub.co.uk to access additional books. The children have already brought home their logging on details. This website is extremely beneficial and also has numeracy activities for your child to help them practise basic skills.

Water bottles - Please ensure bottles used in class have your child's name on and are taken home at the end of each day to be cleaned to avoid the spreading of germs. Flavoured water and juice are not permitted.

## KS1 Curriculum Overview

<u>English</u> - Throughout the term we will be looking at acquiring a range of skills such as speaking and listening and drama from all genres. Daily Phonics sessions will link in with spellings. These will be done in their Spelling Books will go out each week and their learning will be reviewed on Fridays. We will link our learning in with other areas of learning, for example non-fiction will include writing information about dinosaurs and fiction will perfectly fit in with our taditional tales learning after half term

<u>Mathematics</u> - Daily reinforcement of basic number skills and facts through various teaching methods such as games, partner work and independent challenges. Homework linked into the area being covered will go out on a Friday and is to be returned on the following Tuesday.

- <u>Science</u> The first half term we continue with our 'Seasonal Changes' theme. Sessions will involve discussions, investigations and virtual experiments.
- <u>R.E.</u> The topics we will cover this term are 'Special People', 'Meals' and 'Change' but please see the parents leaflet for more details. We will also spend time looking at Judaism in our Other Faiths Week.
- <u>P.E.</u> Our allotted times for the hall are Thursday afternoons and Friday mornings. Could I please ask that your child keeps a complete kit (white t-shirt & navy/black shorts) in school at all times. The children in Reception will be going swimming on Thursday mornings, accompanied by Mrs Brydon. Please keep the swimming rota handy so you know when your child is due to go. Swimming kits consist of costume/trunks, swimming hat and towel. On swimming days can we advise warm coats and girls to avoid wearing tights.

<u>Computing</u> - The children will have the opportunity to practise their skills through other subjects such as Numeracy, Literacy, and Creativity. They will use various forms of technology such as laptops, iPads, microphones and cameras. We welcome Sally Langdon a computing whizz from Durham Cricket Club on Wednesdays this first half term. She will be introducing skills linked to our Dinosaur topic.

<u>Music</u> - Sofia from The Sage will continue to come into school on a weekly basis to help deliver our music curriculum. Exploring sounds through singing, percussion and ICT will all be covered throughout the year.

<u>Creativity Topic</u> - This cross curricular approach helps link all subjects (Art, D&T,Geography & History) together under a theme. Our topic title this term is 'What happened once upon a time?'. Within this topic we will look at traditional tales but start with 'Dinosaurs' which the children are already very excited about!.

**Foundation Stage** children will be increasingly included in some of the above sessions, where appropriate and at their level. Their basic skills in English and mathematics will be practised daily either as a whole group, in pairs or one on one. Learning through play is a huge part of this age range and the children will experience this daily.

**Little J's** will have access to the relevant learning areas for them to learn through play. Mrs Brydon and myself are their Key Workers and at points through the week we will sit and do adult directed activities with them to ensure their progression and development. Little J's will join the Stay and Play session for the first 15 –20 minutes each Wednesday. The Nursery children also require a PE kit, wellies and water bottles in school, all named please.
