- In the event of snowy conditions, parents may receive a text message to pick their child up at an earlier time. Keeping everyone safe will always be our priority.

#### **Attendance**

Attendance at school is a legal requirement and all children are expected to attend school daily unless they are unwell. It is of the utmost importance that children are in school each day in order for them to get the most out of school and achieve the best possible outcomes. In order to achieve high standards, and ensure that children are not missing out on valuable learning, please make sure that children are only absent from school when absolutely necessary.

#### **Persistent Absence**

If your child's attendance falls to 90% or below, this is considered, by the Government to be persistent absence. Where attendance falls below 90% and there are unauthorised absences, this may result in a referral to the Local Authority for enforcement action.

We ask that you do not book a holiday in term time and I would like to remind you that leave of absence for holidays will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances.

#### **Fairtrade Fortnight**

#### What is Fairtrade Fortnight?

For two weeks each year thousands of individuals, companies and groups across the UK come together to share the stories of the people who grow our food and drinks and who grow the cotton in our clothes, people who are often exploited and underpaid.

Fairtrade Fortnight this year will take place from Monday 24th February -Sunday 8th March. In school the children will be learning all about cocoa, the special role women farmers play in the journey to living incomes, and will work on ways of promoting and encouraging people to choose to buy Fairtrade chocolate, as well as other Fairtrade products.

#### **ParentPay**

Please ensure your ParentPay account is kept up to date with payments. It is essential for school dinners and breakfast club to be credited on a regular basis to enable provisions to be bought. ParentPay allows payments to be made at anytime of the day and for future payments to be made to keep your account in credit. Thank you for your support.

# **Fundraising**

I would like to take this opportunity to thanks the Friends of St. Joseph's who have worked so hard to fundraise for the school. Their time, care and support is greatly appreciated.

## **School Uniform**

#### <u>Jewellery</u>

I would like to remind you that jewellery is not to be worn by children during the school day. For health and safety reasons earrings **must** be removed before children come to school. On the rare occasion where there is a problem, and earrings cannot be removed, then they must be taped up prior to coming to school—please come into school and see us if this is the case.

While we encourage children to wear watches for school, we have noticed that some of these are 'Fitbit' style watches. Whilst we see the benefit of wearing a 'Fitbit', and encourage children to improve their fitness as well as skills of telling the time, we do recognise that these watches are expensive to buy. It is for this reason that I am reminding you that we cannot accept any responsibility for these items if they are lost or damaged whilst at school; allowing your child to wear a Fitbit for school is at your own discretion. Any watches with access to photography or internet access are not allowed in school for safeguarding reasons. 04
