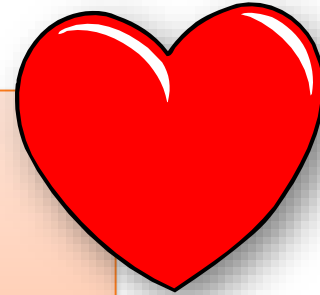
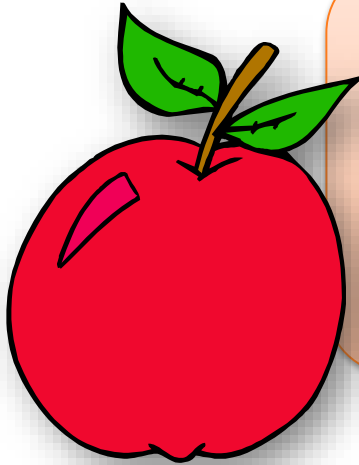

as 'a dog' or 'an animal'.

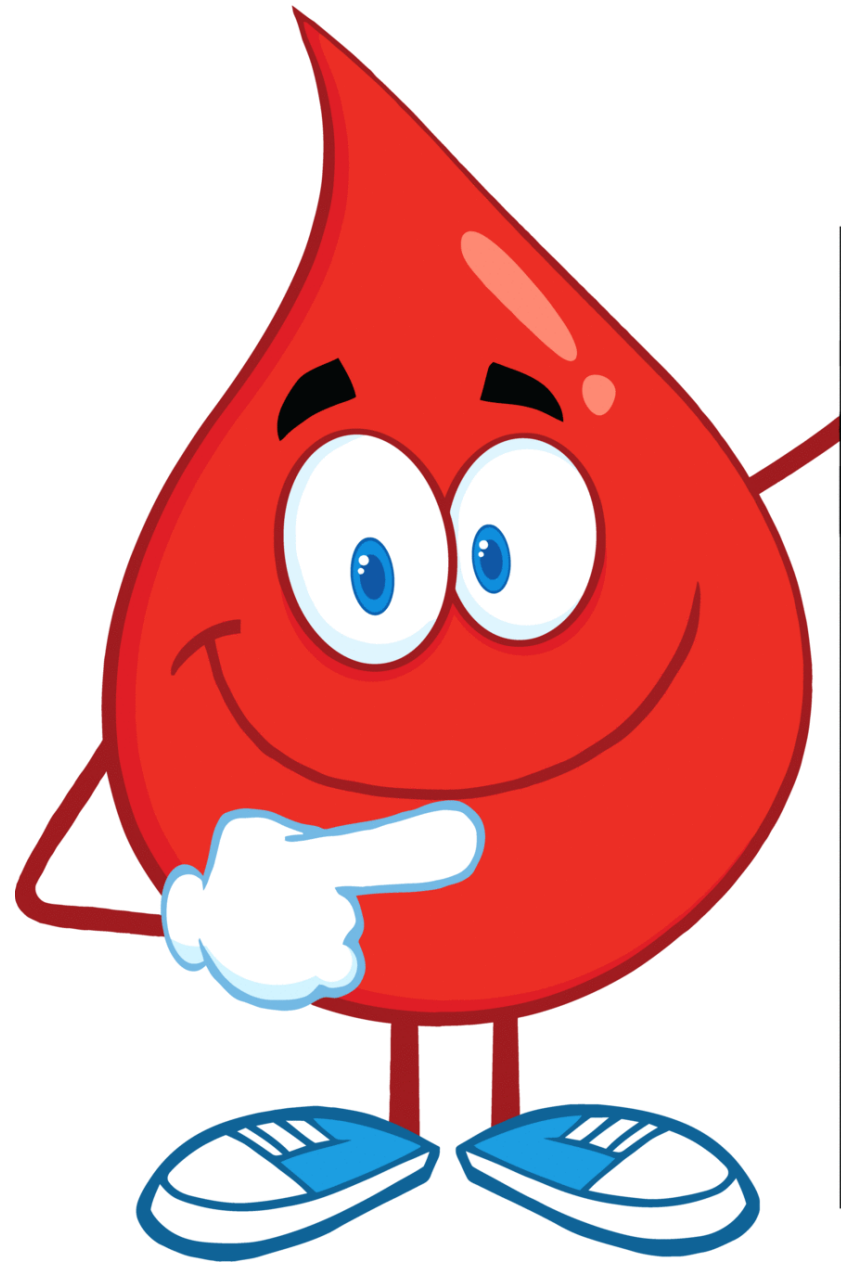

an umbrella

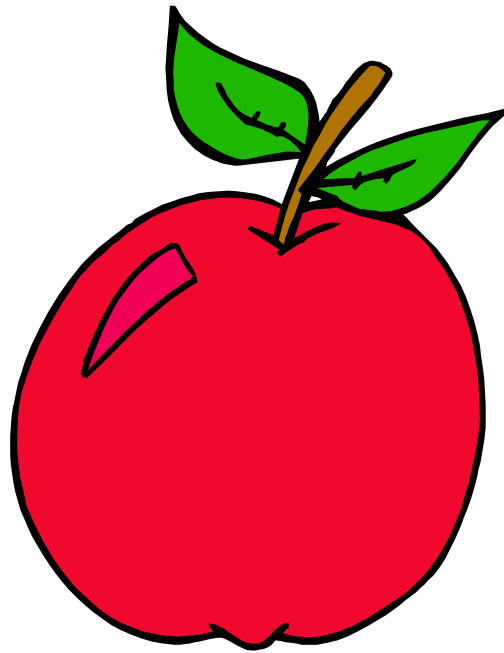
