


We will also discover how light travels and how we can see. We will investigate reflection and shadows. We will focus on key vocabulary to gain a sound, scientific understanding of the topic.

There will be a number of events up and coming over the next couple of months, so please check the school newsletters for the dates, as I am sure you will be looking forward to some of the things that are planned for.


Our class novels for the term, are Beowulf by Michael Morpurgo and Viking Boy by Tony Bradman . The novels link in well with our History, Geography and PSHE work. One is the oldest surviving epic in British literature: Beowulf's terrifying quest to destroy Grendel, the foul fiend, a hideous sea-hag and a monstrous fire-dragon and the other is the coming of age story of Gunnar, whose peaceful life on his family steading is shattered forever by raiders. Our reading and writing activities will link to the books and will include an adventure narrative, a set of instructions,



In art and design, we will develop drawing skills by focusing on portraiture. We will use a range of materials that link to the exploration of proportion, line and tone. We will look at a range of artists including Andy Warhol and Boris Schmitz.

In design and technology, we will develop cooking and nutrition skills further, through making pretzels.

In Maths, we will begin by looking at Place Value, before moving on to the four operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We will then look at fractions and converting units. We will be further developing our reasoning and problem solving skills. We will continue to develop our rapid recall of number facts and the relationships between numbers to deepen our understanding through our mental maths and arithmetic lessons.







Through our Celebration of the Word, we continue to celebrate the liturgical year.

Across this term, we will continue to revitalise and renew our faith through a combination of scripture reading, prayer and discussion. Our topics in RE will include Domestic Church, Baptism and Confirmation and Advent. We will also dedicate time to discovering more about the Jewish faith.



From Sunday 1st December, we will begin the season of advent as we prepare for the birth of Jesus.

In History, we will be focusing on Anglo-Saxon and Viking Britain, revisiting key concepts and deepening our understanding of the past.
